
Working Links: Moving On

- Most referrals come from London Probation Trust but we work with many community partners like Jobcentre Plus and other statutory organisations too
- Overall contract delivery is centred on a participant-focused 'Case Management' model
- Strong challenges where participants fail to keep to agreements


Moving On: Our prison presence

Custody-specific Case Managers provide services in eight prisons:


