Please tell us why your proposed consortium came together and when you plan to be operational:

SSCC is a consortium of 30 companies delivering a range of interventions across Cornwall. We came together based on the idea that the key element to help a person to move forward is different for everyone. SSCC offers a diverse range of providers ranging from traditional training establishments, social enterprises and even circus skills. SSCC promotes working with the 'whole' person and how support in other areas will lead to the reduction of reoffending. We plan to be a legal entity by 31.7.13 and have made progress in securing alternative funding to pilot delivery alongside the capacity building process.

Objective

What does your consortium aim to achieve and deliver when it is operational?

SSCC formed to bring innovative and supportive pathways that deliver effective interventions for those with SMD who have found themselves on offending pathways. We plan to do this by the creation of 2 social enterprises, 4 Work and BF Adventure Cafe and utilising the existing expertise within SSCC. We aim to be operational in July 2013 to deliver both capacity building and pilot work.
